'12: Civil War (Managua destroyed). '27: Pres. Diaz allows US intervention →Sandino's 5-year war against US occupation / Moncada pres. '31: Earthquake Managua (12000 death). - ☺ Head to the Malecón for views on Laguna de Masaya and Volcán Santiago.

Worth The Extra \$€¥

- 👉 Visit the Masaya/Nindirí crater (100c). Take a cab 250-300c both ways) to the crater, or take a bus to Managua/Granada and let the driver know you're going to Volcán Masaya: It's a long hike though!
- 👉 For the enthusiasts: Museo de Folklore (in Mercado Artesanías), Fortaleza de Coyotepe, [Museo y galería de Héroes y Martires.](#)

Budget Bites

- ⌘ Markets: Mercado Municipal, next to bus terminal.
- ⌘ Cheaper supermarket: Palí (Parque Central).
- ⌘ Nicaragua's streetfood: Nacatamales, (corn dough with meat), tortilla, mais, vigoron (yuca/pork/salad), baho (yuca/beef/plantain /salad), gallo pinto (rice & beans), quesillo (tortilla with melted cheese & pineapple), tajadas (deep-fried plantain chips), taco, hamburger, hot dog. Lots of streetfood is available at Parque Central.

Sleep Cheap

Many cheap, locally-owned hotels don't have a website and can't be found on booking engines. For the cheapest deals, just head into town without a booking and ask around. We stayed at the basic Hotel Regis for \$5 p.p.p.n. in a private room (6 blocks south of Parque Central).

Next?

Free-Riding?

- In the centre of Masaya everything is walkable... even when the locals say it's '*largo*' (in that case they're usually talking about 8-15 blocks, which is still only a 10-15 minute walk).
- Minivans to UCA (Managua) leave from the park in front of Iglesia de San Miguel. Other buses and minivans go from the bus station, east of Mercado Municipal.
- Biking is possible, but don't expect consideration of car and bus drivers.
- Taxi's are quite pricy compared to buses and take your precautions. Foreigner = money, which can attract robbers. Use only the official cabs with white-red number plate. Negotiate the price up front (per group, not per person).

Tip: Download the free Triposo Nicaragua app for an offline map, offline guide & more. Load Google Maps when you have wifi and leave it open, you will still be able to use it offline.
