'45: military coup, New constitution. '51: Vargas elected president, stiff opposition → '54: suicide. '56: Pres Kubitschek, rapid economic growth. '60: Capital moved to Brasilia. '60: Pres Quadro. '64: Military coup, state-ownership. Murders & disappearances. '74: Pres Geisel. '82: Halt payment foreign debt (one of world's biggest). '85: Pres Sarney → Cruzado Plan: Freezing prices and wages to halt inflation → high rise when freeze lifted. '88: New constitution reducing presidential powers. '89: Pres Collor de Mello. Foreign debt payments suspended. Pres corruption: new pres: Franco. '94: Pres Cardoso, acknowledges existence of slavery. '96: Police kills 19 Amazon peasants. Budget Bites

⌘ It's recommended to take groceries from Angra dos Reis, as everything has to be imported to the island by boat and is therefore pricy. There are small grocery stores available, however.

⌘ **Local food:** Pão de queijo (cheese bread), açai (superfood), coxinha (chicken), cassava (yucca), paçoca (peanut candy), pamonha (corn dumpling), pastel (deepfried pastry), salgado & kibe & empada (pastry), tapioca, churasco (meat), acarajé (deep-fried prawn snack), rice & beans.

⌘ **Go vegan:** Being vegan is ridiculously easy in Brazil. Every bigger supermarket has soy milk (various brands), soy burgers, soy, tofu, vegan cheese and yoghurt etc... but on Ilha Grande you won't find any, so buy it in advance. Check all vegan-friendly restaurants on [Happy Cow – Ilha Grande](#).

Mama Said

☠ Ilha Grande is relatively safe, but always use common sense. Don't take valuables along or take expensive cameras or phones out on the street. Don't enter the favelas around Angra dos Reis.

☠ Tap water is not drinkable. Use filtered or bottled water.

☠ Corruption is high in Brazil, especially among cops or government officials. Try to avoid problems with them.

Nights Best Spent

Nightlife area: Abraão. Restaurants and bars attract artists to play live music. You're obliged to pay a fee for them if you sit on the terrace.

Free-Riding?

■ There's no transport on the island, so every distance has to be walked.

■ There are no bicycle lanes and within the villages distances are so short it's not worth renting a bike for.

■ There are no buses nor cars on the island. The bus terminal in Angra dos Reis is located at Avenida Almirante Jair Carneiro Toscano de Brito 110, only 20 minutes walking from the ferry.

■ To reach the island you can take the daily ferry service or pay for a more expensive speedboat. The timetables for the cheaper ferry service can be found [here](#).

■ **Airport:** Ilha Grande is located in between Rio de Janeiro and São Paulo.

■ **Hitch-hiking** is not very safe in the provinces of Rio and São Paulo and more up north. There are many favelas which are certainly not recommended to enter or get near to as a foreigner. Instead, use apps like [Blablacar](#) to get a cheap(er) ride from and to the port from Ilha Grande.
