- 器 Markets: Mercado del Norte (Calle Maipú & Mendoza), <u>Mercofrut</u> (Avenida de Circunvalacion & Avenida Democracia).
- **光** Local food: Asado, parilla, chimichurri, empanadas, choripan.
- ₩ Go vegan: Muna Muna (Rivadavia 431), Fon (Maipu 435), Lotos (Buenos Aires 294), Shitake (9 de Julio 94). Check all vegan-friendly restaurants on Happy Cow.

Mama Said

- Don't walk inside Parque 9 de Julio after sunset.
- Boycott zoos like Reserva Horco Molle, where animals are held in captivity.
- Tap water is drinkable, but if you just arrived in the country you are better off with filtered water.
- Before going on long hikes, inform others about your where abouts and indicated time of return.
- Don't destroy nature, always walk on the indicated paths. Take your trash home. Don't make a fire in the woods.

Sleep Cheap

Free-Riding?

- Everything within the centre of San Miguel de Tucúman is more or less walkable.
- Due to heavy traffic and drivers not being used to cyclists it's not recommendable to rent a bicycle.
- City buses bring you everywhere within the centre and to the surrounding villages. You need a public transport pass, but you can pay a local and ask to swipe their pass. Destinations are displayed up front and at the stops. The bus terminal for long-distance buses is located at Avenida Brigido B. Terán 250. The tourist office has excellent hand-outs with all recent bus timetables.
- Airport: Teniente General Benjamín Matienzo International Airport (TUC).
- There are occasional trains from Buenos Aires from San Miguel de Tucuman., arriving and leaving from the Mitre Station, Corrientes 1019.
- Hitch-hiking is possible and very common here. In order to pre-arrange a ride & share gas costs for long routes, try <u>Carpoolear</u> or the Facebook-pages <u>Grativiajes</u> and <u>Camiones y Mochilas</u> (all in Spanish!).

Tip: Download the Triposo Argentina app for offline maps, landmark descriptions & more, or load Google Maps when you have Wi-Fi and leave it open, you will still be able to use it offline.
