1st: Aymara's. 1438-1527: Inca's in west. Spanish arrived → 1532: Battle of Cajamarca against Inca's. Spanish colonial times: Bolivia 'upper Peru' / Charcas. Conversion to Christianity. 1548: La Paz founded by Mendoza: *Nuestra Senora de La Paz*. Gold discovered in Rio Choqueyapu. 1770s: Revolt Tupác Amaru II against harsh treatment Indians. 1809: Liberals of rebel armies under the command of Bolivar & Sucre: Battle of Ayacucho. 1825: Independent. 19th century: Peru-Bolivian Confederation → War of Confederation. 1879-83: War of the Pacific: Bolivia lost coast & nitrate rich fields to Chile. 20th century: Discrimination of indigenous people.1898: Government in La Paz. 1941: Revolutionary Nationalist Movement (Marxist) → 1952: Bolivian National Revolution: include Aymara/Quechua population. 1964: Military junta overthrew president Paz Estenssoro → many presidents. Current: Morales (indigenous): nationalize gas fields.

- © Cementerio General: Free morbid art & a sneak-peek at the true Bolivian culture.
- © I put a spell on you: Visit the Witch Market.

### Worth The Extra \$€¥

- Death Road. Prices vary. (Avoid Chacaltaya).
- Sacha Runa: Shamism & ayahuasca.
- Museo de Arte Contemporaneo, Av. 16 Julio 1968
- ② Almost free: For 3 boliviano's take up the *teleferico* to the Altiplano and enjoy spectacular views. There are 2 different lines.
- © Climb the Illimani, Huayna Potosi or the Monte Chacaltaya. Do it yourself for free or book a guide.
- © Take public transport to Tiwanaku: Ancient ruins.

## Tourist Trap Alert

- Cholita wrestling: Invented for tourists.Curious locals pay only a fraction of your price.
- ② Urban Rush: Can be a lot of fun, but check first if you can even climb stairs in La Paz with this sickening altitude.
- ☼ La Paz Tourist Bus: Just no. Take a local collectivo to not lose your dignity.
- Work for a bed & food: This is dirt cheap in Bolivia. Unless you want to work for €5-8 per day, I wouldn't recommend it.

- Route 36 (illegal), ask the taxi driver.

- ♦ Cine Center, Irpavi (Zona Sur).

## Free-Riding?

- The bus system is used for long-distance travel. In the city (dirt cheap) *collectivos* are used. On the front you can find the destination.
- Taxi's are cheap, but can be very dangerous in Bolivia. Armed muggings are common. Only use official companies, let your hostel call a radio taxi. Never go in a cab with strangers. As a woman, go with men you know.

- Streetfood is dirt cheap (less then €1). Try it at the
  Mercado Lanza (upstairs) or Mercado Camacho. Tasty:
  salteñas, tucumanas, choclo, llauchas, anticuchos, saice.
- # Go to local restaurants and order *almuerzo* (lunch) or *menu del dia* for 7-12 bolivianos. 3-course meal.

#### Mama Said

- Don't trust an un-uniformed police. It's a scam.
- Watch your bag, buy a lock. Smartphones are popular.
- NEVER take an unofficial taxi or go in a cab with strangers. Let your hostel call one. Kidnapping, assault and robberies are a serious threat.
- Don't try to get into San Pedro prison. (Risks in blog).
