History Recap Over 1 Drink

1st: Aymara's. 1438-1527: Inca's in west. Spanish arrived → 1532: Battle of Cajamarca against Inca's. Spanish colonial times: Bolivia 'upper Peru' / Charcas. Conversion to Christianity. 1545: Potosí founded, silver mining town. 1770s: Revolt Tupác Amaru II against harsh treatment Indians. Since 1608: 1500-2000 African slaves per year to Potosí. 1809: Liberals of rebel armies under the command of Bolivar & Sucre: Battle of Ayacucho. 1825: Independent. 19th century: Peru-Bolivian Confederation → War of Confederation. 1879-83: War of the Pacific: Bolivia lost coast & nitrate rich fields to Chile. 20th century: Discrimination of indigenous people. 1941: Revolutionary Nationalist Movement (Marxist) → 1952: Bolivian National Revolution: include Aymara/Quechua population. 1964: Military junta overthrew president Paz Estenssoro → many presidents. Current: Evo Morales (indigenous): nationalize gas fields.

- Take a collectivo to Tarapaya for a short hike.

Worth The Extra \$€¥

- A must: Silver mine tour, guided by a miners. I had a good experience at Koala Tours. Take some extra cash to buy some presents (soft drinks, coca leaves, dynamite) for the miners.
- Casa Nacional de Moneda, Calle Ayacucho.
- Visit Parque Nacional Torotoro by yourself or with a guide.

Tourist Trap Alert

© Some hostels offer a bed and food if you work for them. Honestly, food and lodging are ridiculously cheap in Bolivia. You don't want to work for a few euros per day.

Mama Said

- Natch your bag, buy a lock. You'll need it.
- Don't wander around in the dark. Especially not alone, and especially not in deserted areas. Bolivia is a poor country and muggings and theft are common.
- Only use official taxi's. >
- Bring a scarf or a mouth cap to protect yourself during the mine tour.
- Bring altitude pills or buy coca leaves. Warm clothes are also recommended for night time.

Free-Riding?

- The bus system is used for long-distance travel. In the city (dirt cheap) *collectivos* are used. On the front you can find the destination.
- Taxi's are cheap, but can be very dangerous in Bolivia. Armed muggings are common. Only use official companies, let your hostel call one. Never go in a cab with strangers. As a woman, go with men you know.
