# History Recap Over 1 Drink

500BC: Thracian tribes. Alexander the Great. Roman Empire. 681: Bulgarian state. 890s: Cyrillic alphabet. 1018-1186: Byzantine Empire. 1396: Ottoman Empire (5 centuries). 1876: Uprising against Ottoman rule violently oppressed. '78: Treaty of San Stefano (by Russia/Turkey): autonomous Bulgaria. '78: Treaty of Berlin: smaller Bulgarian principality, eastern Rumelia Ottoman → merged with Bulgaria in '86. '87: Prince Ferdinand of Saxe-Coburg-Gotha (later tsar). 1908: Independent Kingdom. '14-'18: WWI, ally Germany > 100,000 Bulgarian troops killed, most severe loss of any country. '39-'45: WWII → Soviet army invades German-occupied Bulgaria in '44: Soviet-backed Fatherland Front: power. '46: Monarchy abolished → republic: Communist Party. '47: New constitution → 1-party state (Zhivkov president). Economy nationalized. USSR ally. '84: Government tries to force Turkish minority to take Slavic names: resistance, 300,000 flee country. '89: Democratisation > multi-party system, UDF formed. '90: Economic crisis, Communist Party back as Socialist Party (BSP). Mass demonstrations, strikes: government collapses. '93: Mass privatization program. '96: Financial turmoil. 2004: NATO. '07: EU. Corruption (EU criticism). '12: Suicide bomber kills 6 in Burgas. '14: Banking crisis.

- **& Local food:** Moussaka (potato-egg-pork oven dish), Sarmi (rice rolls), Gyuvech (beef-veggie-stew), Kiufte (köfte minced pork), Kebabche (grilled meat), Shishche (meat-veggie skewers), Sach (meat stew), Banitsa (stuffed pastry), Lyutenitsa (tomato-pepper relish), Shopska Salata (salad), Kyopolou (eggplant with bellpeppers), Tarator (soup), Meshana Skara (mixed grill), Lukanka (salami), Shkembe Chorba (hangover tripe soup), Job Sandwich, Princessa Sandwich, Rakia (alcohol) Oblak (cocktail), Mastika (watermelon with alcohol), Boza (wheat-fermented drink).
- **Go vegan:** Being vegan is ridiculously easy in Europe, but can be challenging in meat-loaded Bulgaria (but doable). Local vegan dishes: Kyopolou, Lutenica, Bob Chorba, Lozovi Sarmi, Bean Soups. There are quite some vegan restaurants, especially in Sofia. Check them here: Happy Cow Sofia. I specifically recommend Salted Café and Dream House.

### Mama Said

- Europe in general, and also Sofia, is very safe... but use your common sense like everywhere. Known pickpocket-areas are the Central Railway Station, Vitosha Blvd, Zhenski Market and public transport.
- Boycott zoos or aquariums like Zoo Sofia, where animals are held in captivity.
- Tap water is drinkable.
- Bulgarians shake their head up and down when they mean 'no' and left to right for 'yes'.

# Sleep Cheap

- ♣ Hostels and alternative accommodation are pretty affordable in Bulgaria. Prices vary widely per day based on demand, so I recommend to get the cheapest deal for that day on Booking.com. Get an extra \$15 discount via this Booking.com link! (Wild) Camping is officially illegal, but tolerated if you're discrete and don't build fires.
- ❖ Go Couchsurfing or Housesitting (20% discount for Trusted Housesitters via this link!) Also check WorkAway or HelpX for work-exchanges.

- ♦ Nightlife areas: Vitosha Boulevard & surroundings, Tsar Ivan Shishman Street, Studentski Grad.
- ♦ Theatres: Ivan Vazov National Theatre, Salza I Smyah Drama Theatre, NATFIZ, Theatre 199, National Opera and Ballet, State Satirical Theatre, Bulgaria Hall Complex, National Music and Ballet Center, Sofia Theatre, Theatre Vazrajdane, Little City Theatre.

## Free-Riding?

- Walking is an excellent option to see the more subtle details of Sofia.
- Biking is rather dangerous due to the potholes and bad bicycle lanes, but possible. <u>Bike rental</u> available.
- Sofia is connected by a cheap bus/trolleybus/tram/ metro system. You need a new ticket for every vehicle change and a separate ticket for a big piece of luggage. Tickets must be bought in advance at ticket machines, kiosks or from the driver and punched manually (every vehicle has a different pattern they check regularly). Daily/weekly/monthly tickets are available at kiosks. Separate tickets are required for night buses. The central bus terminal is located next to the main railway station. Budget bus lines are Eurolines and Flixbus.
- Airport: Sofia Airport (SOF). The blue metro line or bus 84 is connected with the airport.
- Hitchhiking is relatively safe and quite common. You can also use apps like Blablacar for a cheap ride.
