800: Agricultural indigenous communities. 1535: Successful Araucanian resistance against Spanish. '41: Valdivia begins Spanish conquest, Santiago founded → Araucanians kill Valdivia. 1814: Spanish regain control → '17: defeated by Army of Andes led by San Martín & O´Higgins → '18: Independent with O´Higgins as leader. '23-30: Civil War between liberal federalists & conservative centralists (last wins). 18th century: Landowners economic/political force → changes with Pres Montt. 1879-84: War of Pacific with Peru/Bolivia, expanded territory 1/3 northward. European immigration, large-scale mining. 1927: Start dictatorship Gen. Ibanez (seized power)→'52: elected pres. Growth US political influence. '64: Pres Montalva: social reforms. '70: Allende president (Marxist): weapons from Cuba, US opposition Nixon. Economic crisis. '73: CIA-sponsored military coup: Allende suicide. New totalitarian regime: Pinochet → Caravan of Death: over 3000 (leftish) Chileans murdered, 29000 imprisoned & tortured, 30000 exiled. 89: Pres Aylwin, Pinochet remains commander-in-chief army. '94: Pres Frei. 2000: Pres Lagos → '04: Divorce law (despite Church's opposition). '06: Pres Bachelet (first female). Free-trade China. Difficult relations with Peru. '10: Pres Pinera. 8.8 earthquake.

# Sleep Cheap

- Osorno is rather expensive. Don't book anything in advance, because the cheapest *hospedajes* and *hostales* don't have websites.
- Go Couchsurfing or house-sitting! Or check workaway.

## Free-Riding?

- Everything within the centre of Osorno is walkable.
- Biking is a good way to explore the environment.
- The bus terminal is a good starting point for daytrips or longer bus trips. It's located here: Calle Errazuriz 1400. The minibus-terminal behind the market is a cheaper alternative for destinations close by.
- Taxis are relatively expensive and take your precautions. Foreigner = money, which can attract robbers.
- Hitch-hiking is possible and very easy, but there's always a risk. However, I had no problems doing it as a solo female traveller.

Tip: Download the free Triposo Chile app for an offline map, offline guide & more. Load Google Maps when you have wifi and leave it open, you will still be able to use it offline.
