Budget Bites

- **Big supermarkets:** Lidl, Aldi *(those 2 are the cheapest),* Rema 1000, Irma, Netto.
- **& Local food:** Smørrebrød (sandwiches), frikadeller (meatballs), flæskesteg (pork), kogt torsk (cod), leverpostej (liver), gule ærter (pea soup), sild (herring), tarteletter (puff-pastry), krebinetter (pork patties), stegt flæk (pork belly), pølse (hot dog), æbleflæsk (apple pork dates), wienerbrød (pastry). Have a look at Papirøen and Torvehallerne food halls.
- **Go vegan:** Being vegan is ridiculously easy in Europe and also in Denmark. However, Denmark is VERY expensive and so is vegan food. Every bigger supermarket has an endless supply of vegan products and there are many vegan/vegetarian restaurants. Check them here: Happy Cow Copenhagen.

Mama Said

- Europe in general, and also Denmark is very safe... but use your common sense like everywhere.
- Tap water is drinkable.
- The Danes are hot for (traffic) rules and whatever feels totally normal and acceptable for you could for them be a violation worth a heavy fine. Be careful.
- Boycott zoos or aquariums, like Copenhagen Zoo (Frederiksberg) and Den Bla Planet National Aquarium, where animals are held in captivity.
- If you're really on a budget, and have no money to spend... maybe Denmark is not the place for you, as except of Norway it's the most expensive country in Europe.

Free-Riding?

- Copenhagen is rather big and walking distances are long. However, sightseeing on foot allows you to see the more subtle details of town.
- Copenhagen has a bike sharing system called Bycyklen. The bicycles have GPS.
- Trains in Denmark are operated by <u>DSB</u>. Ticket prices are very high. There are trains to Copenhagen's suburbs, as well as to other cities all over the country. Without a train pass prices are almost double.
- There's a rather extensive bus network Denmark in the city of Copenhagen, as well as all over the country. DSB operates the main bus lines, but cheaper buslines like <u>Eurolines</u> and <u>Flixbus</u> stepped into the market.
- Airport: Copenhagen Airport / Københavns Lufthavne Kastrup (CPH).
- Hitch-hiking is relatively safe, although not very common in Denmark. You can also use apps like Blablacar to get a cheap(er) ride.
