

'86: Pres Azcona del Hoyo. '87: Alvarez assassinated. '89: demobilization of Nica Contras. '90: Pres Callejas. '93: Pres Reina. '97: Pres Flores. '98: Hurricane Mitch. 2000: 1000+ street children murdered death squads backed by police  $\rightarrow$  '01: UN intervention.'02: Pres Maduro. '03-04: Troops to Iraq. Free trade agreement US. Gang violence. '05: Tropical strom Gamma. Pres Zelava. New border with ES. '07: Media=government propaganda. Territorial dispute settled with Nica. '08: Joins ALBA, Latin left/anti-US (headed by Chavez, Venezuela). '09: Zelaya into exile. Pres Lobo. '11: High murder rate.

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### Budget Bites

緩 Markets: Around Parque Central.

彩 Supermarket: Dispensa (at Parque Central).

Honduras' streetfood / *comedores*: Baleada (tortilla with mashed beans/cheese/egg/avocado), pupusas (similar to baleada), tortillas, enchiladas, rice & beans: in the Garifuna vlllages with coconut, tajadas (deep-fried plantain chips), soup, pan de coco (coconut bread) tamales and kilo's of meat and seafood.

The most delicious chop suey: Yue Liang, Parque Central.

# Free-Riding?

Within Tela everything is walkable. Don't walk at night.

Biking is possible, hotels rent them out.

■ Buses drive along the main road (just walk away from the beach, straight, until you can't walk any further anymore) and pick up passengers at the Uno gas station. The official terminal is in Avenida Nicaragua. The chicken bus terminal is in Calle del Comercio (center). Some companies have their own terminals. Check my photos for a map.

■ Taxi's are quite pricy compared to buses and take your precautions. Foreigner = money, which can attract robbers. Taxi's are shared, others might get into the cab too.

Tip: Download the free Triposo Honduras app for an offline map, offline guide & more. Load Google Maps when you have wifi and leave it open, you will still be able to use it offline.
