## Budget Bites

- 器 Big supermarkets: Albi, Meridian, Viva Fresh.
- **Markets:** Bazaar.
- **Local food:** Burek (Albanian börek), Flija (pie with pancake layers and yoghurt filling), Raznjici (grilled meat skewer), Cevapi (grilled minced meat), Sarma (cabbage rolls), Pljeskavica (hamburger), Punjene Paprike (stuffed paprikas), Tavë (lamb), Tavë Krapi (pot-cooked carp), Rakija (alcoholic drink).
- **Go vegan:** Being vegan is ridiculously easy in Europe, but slightly challenging in Kosovo. <u>Local</u> 'accidentally vegan' dishes: Prebranac (baked beans), Ajvar (red peppers garlic spread) & Posni Burek (vegan börek). Check vegan-friendly restaurants here: Happy Cow Pristina.

#### Mama Said

- Unlike what you've probably heard, Pristina is very safe. The war has been over for a loooong time.
- Tap water is drinkable, yet if you're not used to it bottled water is recommended.
- ATM fees are very high here. If you can bring in euros from outside of Kosovo. do so.

#### Free-Riding?

- Walking is an excellent option to see the more subtle details of downtown Pristina. To see the entire city alternative transport might be necessary.
- Pristina is connected by a bus system, you can pay the driver. The bus station is located close to the M2 south-west of the centre (Google: Stacioni I Autobusve), bus 7 brings you downtown from there. Buses to Serbia leave mainly from Gracanica, ask locals about times as they vary per day. More info on Pristina transport here.
- The train station is located at Tirana street. More info here.
- Airport: Pristina Airport (PRN).
- Hitchhiking is possible, but not so common here.
