Budget Bites

- **Big supermarkets:** Mydin, Sam's Groceria, TMC, Cold Storage, Giant, Jaya Grocer, Hock Choon a.o.
- **Markets:** Chow Kit, Central Market, Kampung Baru, Jalan Pasar, Jalan Sayar, Besar Pudu, Tuman Tun Dr. Ismail, Tani Mega Section 17, Imbi, Borong Selangor, Taman Pertama, a.o.
- **Example 1** Local food: Nasi Lemak, Nasi Goreng (rice dishes), Satay (skewer), Cendol (cold dessert soup), Roti Canai (Indian), Laksa (soup), Fish Head Curry, Chicken Curry, Roti Jala ((netlike crepes), Popiah (spring rolls), Mee Goreng (noodles), Beef Rendang (curry), Ikan Bakar (grilled fish), Bak Kut Teh (pork ribs broth), Sambal Udang (spicy shrimp), Rojak (fruit & veggie salad with fish), Chee Cheong Fun (rice noodle rolls), Lok Lok (hot pot), Durian, Otak Otak (fish cakes), Bee Hoon (rice noodles), Banana Leaf Rice (Indian), Murtabak.
- **Go vegan:** Being vegan is very easy and cheap in Malaysia and especially in Kuala Lumpur. Every supermarket has vegan products and there are many vegetarian and vegan restaurants... check them on Happy Cow Kuala Lumpur.

Mama Said

- Example 1 Kuala Lumpur is generally safe, but as it's a capital city it's a bit more unsafe than the rest of the country. Be aware of pickpockets and bag-snatching. As in most places, don't walk alone at night. Worse areas at night: Chow Kit, backside Petaling Street, Brickfields (red light district), Doraisamy Street.
- Boycott zoos like Kuala Lumpur Bird Park,
 Butterfly Park, KL Tower Mini Zoo and Aquaria KLCC
 where animals are held in captivity.
- Tap water is not drinkable.
- Only use licensed cabs or take an Uber / Grab.
- Only cash out inside of banks, not on street ATMs.

Sleep Cheap

- ❖ Hostels and hotels are very cheap in Malaysia. Be aware that there are scams with Air BnB and bookingwebsites, so book directly via hotel or verify first.
- ❖ Go Couchsurfing or house-sitting! Also check WorkAway.

Festivals

- Chinese New Year: Feb-Mar.
- Hari Merdeka (National Day): 31-Aug.

Nights Best Spent

- ♦ Nightlife areas: Bukit Bintang, Bangsar, Ampang. Clubs: Rootz Rooftop Bar, Play Club, Gravity Club.
- ♦ Theatre: KLPAC, Panggung Bandaraya City Theatre, Colisseum Theatre, Gardens Theatre.

Free-Riding?

- KL has a rather compact city center, but it's really too hot and humid to walk long distances.
- KL has a bike share system called <u>oBike</u>.
- Public transport is easy, fast and cheap, especially the subway and train system: check map. There's also a monorail and bus system. You can get a MyRapid or Touch 'n Go Card. For intercity transport buses are faster than trains. There are several bus stations in KL, the main one being Pudu Sentral.
- Airport: Kuala Lumpur International Airport (KUL).
- Hitch-hiking is possible, but won't safe you much as public transport is really cheap in Malaysia.
