Mama Said

Morocco generally isn't a safe country and caution should be practiced at all times. As a solo female traveler I highly discourage women to travel here alone... only go in groups or with a man. Always dress conservatively and wear a wedding ring. Hiking generally isn't safe due to robbers and serious crime. The Western Sahara is highly dangerous.

Tap water is not drinkable.

Most mosques and religious sites can only be visited if you're both man and a Muslim.

Islamic Law is strongly enforced. An unmarried man and woman aren't allowed to share a room when one or both are Moroccan, neither is premarital sex; you can face lengthy prison sentences. Avoid public displays of affection. Homosexuality is a criminal offence. Alcohol generally isn't allowed, let alone drugs. Pornographic material is illegal. You need permission to fly drones.

Sleep Cheap

★ Tourist accommodation is pretty cheap in Morocco. Use <u>this link</u> for <u>€15 discount at Booking.com</u>. Get <u>€25 travel money for free</u> on Air BnB with <u>this link</u>. Keep in mind unmarried couples can't share a room when one or both hold a Moroccan passport. Besides hotels, resorts and hostels, you can stay in riads (former private houses of the wealthy), kasbahs (fortress/medina), auberges (guest houses) and berber houses (homestays).

 Camping is very affordable / free, but can be dangerous due to crime and robbers especially working forested areas.

 Go <u>Couchsurfing</u> or Housesitting: get <u>20% off your</u> yearly <u>Trusted Housesitters membership</u> via <u>this link</u>.
 Also check <u>WorkAway</u>.

Nights Best Spent

• **Nightlife areas:** Alcohol is generally prohibited and is only served in hotels. Djemaa el-Fnaa has a lot going on at night.

• Theaters: Theatre Royal.

Free-Riding?

The centre of Marrakech is walkable.

■ Biking isn't recommended due to the locals entirely ignoring any kind of traffic rules. The horse-drawn carriages aren't the most animal-friendly alternative.

 Buses run from 6AM-10PM, generally running every 15-20min. Find more info on routes on the <u>Asla website</u>. The intercity bus station is dependent on de company you're traveling with (CTM/Supratours).

 Marrakech's train station is located at Centre Guéliz, and are operated by <u>ONCF</u>.

■ Taxis are often shared. All taxis are metered, if they say there meter is broken it's a tourist trap to quote you higher rates.

Airport: Menara Airport (RAK).

 Hitchhiking is not recommended in Morocco, especially not for solo female travellers. It's unsafe.
