History Recap Over 1 Drink

1200-1300AD: Ancestors of Māori arrive by canoe from Polynesia. Country name: Aotearoa (land of long white cloud). 1642: Dutch Abel Tasman sights South Island, calls it Nieuw Zeeland (after Dutch province). 1769: British James Cook explores coastline. 1815: First British missionaries arrive. '40: Treaty of Waitangi between British and Māori tribes: protection Māori land and establishes British law. '45-'72: NZ Wars, Māori resistance against colonial rule. '93: NZ 1st country of women vote. '98: Introduction old-age pensions. 1907: NZ dominion within British Empire. '14: WWI→NZ troops to help British. '39-'45: WWII→again. '47: Full independence. '50-'53: NZ troops serve with UN in Korean War. '51: Anzus Pacific security treaty NZ-Aus-US. '60s: Small troops sent to Vietnam War to support US. '84: Labour government (Lange). '85: NZ refuses US nuclear-powered/armed ships to enter ports → Greenpeace ship blown up, Anzus obligations suspended. '89: Palmer, then Bolger Prime Minister (PM). '93: Proportional representation government →more Māori. '97: Shipley 1st female PM. '99: Peacekeeping force in East Timor. Clark PM. '01: Government rescues Air NZ. '02: PM apologizes to Samoa (colonial). '08: Economic recession. Key PM. '09: Troops to Afghanistan for US. '11: Earthquake Christchurch. '13: Gay marriage legal. '16: Bill English PM. Budget Bites

- **Big supermarkets:** New World, Fresh Choice.
- **Markets:** Cromwell Farmers Market (every Sun 9AM -1PM; Labour Weekend until Easter). Fresh fruit and vegetables can be purchased at orchards: Jackson / Freeway / Mrs. Jones Orchards & Webbs Fruit Stall.
- ****Example 2.5 Local food:** Meat Pie, Fish & Chips, Hangi (vegetables & meat), Crayfish, Kina (sea urchin), Pavlova (desert), Honey, Jaffas (sugarcoated chocolate balls), Kumara (sweet potato), Paua Fritters (seafood), Marmite (only if you're brave).
- **Go vegan:** Being vegan is ridiculously easy in New Zealand. Every supermarket has a wide array of vegan products. Cromwell has quite a small restaurant selection, however, and has therefore very little for vegans too. Check out what they have: Happy Cow-Cromwell.

Mama Said

- New Zealand is generally safe, but use your common sense like everywhere. Don't leave valuables in the car or anywhere visible.
- In New Zealand they drive on the left side of the road, so everything is reversed. Pay attention!
- Nhen going on a hike, inform someone about your whereabouts and expected return time. Bring extra food and inform about weather conditions. Take clothes for all climates, but here especially rain and mud! Stay on the tracks to preserve nature.
- Tap water is drinkable.

Sleep Cheap

- ❖ Hostels and alternative accommodation are not cheap in New Zealand, so keep that in mind. There's 1 hostel in Cromwell: Cromwell Backpackers. Book via this Booking.com link and receive a \$15 discount.
- Freedom camping is generally not allowed in New Zealand (but you may be naughty), unless you own a self-contained vehicle (with proof). Check Cromwell freedom camping. Check this link for Cromwell campsites. 'Batches' are popular as holiday homes. Trail huts and campsites can be booked at the Department of Conversation website or at the i-Site Visitor Center.
- Go <u>Couchsurfing</u> or Housesitting (<u>Kiwi</u> <u>Housesitters</u>). Also check <u>WorkAway</u>.

Nights Best Spent

- ♦ **Nightlife:** There isn't any in Cromwell, besides some restaurants. Parties can be found in Queenstown.
- ♦ Movie Theaters: <u>Arthur's Cinema</u>.

Free-Riding?

- Cromwell is compact, but bigger than you think. Not everything is at walking distance.
- Biking is possible and is especially interesting at the mountainbike trails in Cromwell.
- Buses serve the surrounding cities. Intercity buses depart from Lode Lane, off Barry Avenue next to the Mall. Tickets must be bought in advance.
- Airport: Queenstown Airport (ZQN)
- Hitch-hiking is relatively safe in NZ and *very* easy.

Next?

- → In New Zealand: Queenstown, Wanaka, Alexandra, Pisa Moorings, Bannockburn.
