1522: Country named after Indian chief Nicarao (by Gonzalez). '24: Granada/León founded by Cordoba. 1821: Independent from Spain. '23: United Provinces of Central America independent from Mexico / '38: fully independent. '55: William Walker in Granada →'56: Battle of Rivas/San Jacinto→'57: Walker pres.: Slavery/ planned canal →'57: defeated by Costa Rican army, executed. 1900: US/UK signed Hay-Pauncefote Treaty: canal rights (expired in '71).'09: US invasion. '12: Civil War (Managua destroyed). '27: Pres. Diaz allows US intervention → Sandino's 5-year war against US occupation / Moncada pres. '31: Earthquake Managua (12000 death). '36: Begin Somoza family presidents. '41: Enters WWII. 49: Friendship treaty Costa Rica (borders). '61: Sandinista front against US-backed dictatorship Samoza's → '78 attacked/captured León: Somoza starts bombing, tortures/killings. '79: Pres resigned, Sandinista government. Bucket List For Free

- © Visit the petroglyphs, some can be visited for free just before Finca Porvenir.
- © Take a bus to Santo Domingo and swim in the lake while enjoying the view on Volcán Maderas.
- © Punta Jesus Maria: At dry season it's sometimes possible to walk pretty far on a sandbank.

All destinations can be reached with a rented motorbike, car or via a tour. Due to a very unreliable bus 'system' it's unadvisable to take public transport.

Worth The Extra \$€¥

- Climb Volcano Maderas or Concepcion. Check the safety conditions. Arrange early transport (and/or a guide) up front.
- Visit Charco Verde and Ojo de Agua (pool).
- Hike to Cascada San Ramon or kayak Río Istián.
- Museums: Museum El Ceibo, Museo de Ometepe.
- Canopy Sendero Los Monos.

Budget Bites

- **Markets:** Farmers sell fruit and vegetables on the street.
- **X** The island has only small limited supermarkets.
- M Nicaragua's streetfood: Nacatamales, (corn dough with meat), tortilla, mais, vigoron (yuca/pork/salad), baho (yuca/beef/plantain /salad), gallo pinto (rice & beans), quesillo (tortilla with melted cheese & pineapple), tajadas (deep-fried plantain chips), taco, hamburger, hot dog.

Mama Said

- Bring enough cash. There are some ATM's, but they might not work.
- Bring bug spray and sunscreen.
- Don't walk around by yourself at night, not even on this island.

Free-Riding?

- To get here, check the ferry schedule.
- Only within the villages things are walkable.
- Tuktuk's and taxi's usually only leave from Moyogalpa. It's almost impossibe to find one elsewhere.
- Buses go... whenever they want to leave or don't break down. There are schedules, but only the Moyogalpa-bound buses tend to be reliable (and overcrowded).
- It's possible to rent a bike, but be prepared to sweat a lot.
- Conclusion: Rent a motorbike! It seems to be the only efficient way to explore the island by yourself. Not cheap.

Tip: Download the free Triposo Nicaragua app for an offline map, offline guide & more. Load Google Maps when you have wifi and leave it open, you will still be able to use it offline.
