### History Recap Over 1 Drink

6000BC: Nomads. 2500BC: Caral first city. Civilizations developed → Inca's (1438-1532) most powerful, capital: Cusco, language: Quechua, area: Ecuador to central Chile. 1531: Spanish, brought diseases (8,6mln Inca's died). Pizarro: coupe d'état, Battle of Cajamarca. Christianity introduced. Colonial land-tenure structure. 1542: Viceroyalty of Peru in favor of Spain. 18th Century: Incan rebellion (Tupac Amaru II/Atahulpa). 19th Century: Creole rebellion. 1810-24: Wars of Independence, led by San Martín (Argentina) / Bolivar (Venezuela), financed by Chile. 1824: Peru independent. 1836-39: Peru-Bolivian Confederation (reunite) → War of Confederation. 1879-84: War of the Pacific, lost land to Chile. 1884- 1930 Aristocratic republic → reforms under Piérola. 1929: Economic crisis → numerous governments: APRA (Haya de la Torre)-Communist Party (Mariategui)-Rivero-Odria-Haya de la Torre - Godoy (military)-Belaúnde-Velasco-Bermúde-Belaúnde-Garcia-Fujimori (Shining Path)-Toledo-Garcia-Humala. Corruption. 1982-83: El Nino. 1988-90: Hyperinflation.

## Worth The Extra \$€¥

- The highlight: Santa Cruz trek. Quechuandes & Ganesa are recommended companies, but don't offer many treks in low season. Avoid Peru Diamond & Galaxia and bring enough supplies yourself. ±S/300.
- Laguna 69: Daytrip (guide unnecessary) or camp. If possible, stop at Laguna Llanganuco. ±S/30.
- Glaciar Pastoruri: Unforgettable day trip. ±S/35.
- More lagunas: Parón, Hanganucon (Chinancocha / Orconcocha)

# Budget Bites

- # Mercado Central: Cheap fruit, veggies and meals... and a sneak-peak in Peruvian culture.
- 器 Streetfood is dirt cheap. Tasty: salteñas, lomo saltado, quinoa, cuy (guinea pig), rocoto relleno, anticuchos, pollo a la brasa, picarones.
- ₩ Order a *menu del dia* in a local restaurant for as little as 2,5-10 soles.
- ★ Self-catering at Novaplaza Supermercado (Av. Luzuriaga).

## Free-Riding?

- Huaraz is tiny & walkable.
- Buses serve long-distance destinations.Micro's (small vans) run everywhere, a sign indicating the direction. Ask locals which one to take, as there's no clear system. Watch pick-pockets!
- Motortaxi's bring you everywhere in town. Not necessary for the short distances, but convenient as street names and numbers are poorly indicated.
- Taxi's are cheap, but unnecessary in small Huaraz.If you use them, only use official radio taxi's which are safer.
