Worth The Extra \$€¥

- Skiing & Snowboarding: Poiana Brasov, (further away: Azuga, Predeal, Sinaia). Ice-skating: Poiana Brasov, Olympic Ice Rink.
- Museums & sights: <u>Bran Castle</u> (*Dracula*), Museum of Urban Community, Ethnography Museum, <u>Art Museum</u>, History Museum.
- Entertainment: Bowling, Table Tennis, Minigolf & more at Entertainment Center Poiana Brasov. Parc Aventura, Paradisul Acvatic, Smile Agua Park.

Budget Bites

- **Big supermarkets:** Lidl *(cheapest),* Carrefour, Profi, Mega Image.
- **Markets:** Piatra Astra, Piata Star, Piata Tractorul.
- ** Local food: Sarmale (cabbage rolls), Mamaliga (polenta), Zacusca (vegetable dip), Ciorba (soup many kinds), Balmos (corn-flour-cheese-dish), Jumari (smoked bacon), Mici (BBQ meat), Cighir (organ meat balls), Drob (meat loaf / organ haggis), Salata de Vinete (baba ganoush), Placinta (savory pie), Cascaval Pane (deep-fried breaded cheese), Toba (pig-organ-head-stew), Tochitura (pig stew), Chiftele (meat balls), Frigarui (shish kebab), Limba cu Masline (cow tongue), Snitel (schnitzel), Stufat (stew), Papanasi (desert).
- **Go vegan:** Being vegan is ridiculously easy in Europe and especially in Romania, where religious 'fasting food' (mancare depost) is entirely vegan and available everywhere. Local vegan dishes: Zacusca, Sarmales Depost, Mamaliga, Salata de Vinete, Lahnia de Fasole / Fasole Batuta (beans mash), Tocana (vegetable stew), Pilaf de Orez (rice with vegetables), Ardei Umpluti (stuffed bell peppers), Ghiveci (veggie stew), Mancare de Mazare / Praz (pea / leek stew), Chiftelute / Snitel de Ciuperci (mushroom fried stuff). Every bigger supermarket has a big supply of 'depost' products and there are several full-vegan restaurants. Check them here: Happy Cow Brasov. I specifically recommend Ma Cocotte.

Mama Said

- Europe in general, and also Romania, is very safe... but use your common sense like everywhere.
- Boycott zoos or aquariums like Zoo Brasov, where animals are held in captivity.

Sleep Cheap

- ❖ Go Couchsurfing or Housesitting (20% discount for Trusted Housesitters via this link!) Also check WorkAway or HelpX for work-exchanges.

Free-Riding?

- Walking is an excellent option to see the more subtle details of Brasov.
- There's no Brasov bike share system (yet!), but there are several bike rental companies and some hotels and hostels offer this service.
- Brasov is connected by a bus system, which can be rather slow due to traffic. Tickets have to be bought in advance at ticket boxes (only available at certain stops, so when you find a ticket machine buy a few tickets in advance!). Brasov's main bus stop is Livada. There are three central bus terminals for buses out of town: one located at Blvd. Garii 5, one at Strada Avram lancu, and one is called Autogara Bartolomeu (reached by city bus 12 for buses to Bran and Rasnov). Budget bus lines are Eurolines and Flixbus.
- Brasov's station is located at Blvd. Garii 5, and can be reached by bus 4. Trains are operated by CFR; find timetables on their website. Train travel is rather slow, but cheaper and more scenic.
- Airport: Brasov Airport (BRV), Henri Coanda Internatonal Airport (Bucharest OTP).
- Hitchhiking is relatively safe and quite common. You can also use apps like Blablacar for a cheap ride.
