Budget Bites

- 器 Big supermarkets: Lidl, Aldi, Tesco, Sainbury's.
- **Markets:** Farmers Market (Mansfield Park & Queens Park). Find more markets <u>here</u>.
- **& Local food:** Deep-fried Mars bars (for real), Haggis (sheep's heart, liver & lungs), Shortbread (cookies), Porridge, Fish & Chips, Smoked Salmon, Scones, Neeps & Tatties (turnips & potatoes), Bangers & Mash (sausage with mashed potatoes), Black Pudding (blood-based), Leek & Tattie Soup, Scotch Pie (meat pie), Tablet (fudge), Scotch Egg... & Scotch Whiskey.
- **Go vegan:** Being vegan is ridiculously easy in Europe and also in Scotland. However, the UK is expensive and so is vegan food. Every bigger supermarket has an endless supply of vegan products and there are many vegan/vegetarian restaurants. Check them here: Happy Cow Glasgow.

Mama Said

- Europe in general, and also Glasgow is rather safe... but use your common sense like everywhere. Don't walk anywhere alone after sunset, don't take your most important valuables along and always follow your instinct.
- Boycott zoos or aquariums like Sea Life Loch Lomond where animals are held in captivity.
- Tap water is drinkable.
- International banks don't always accept Scottish pounds for exchange, so always require British notes shortly before leaving the country.
- If you're really on a budget, and have no money to spend... maybe the UK is not the place for you, as together with Scandinavia it's more expensive than the rest of Europe.

Nights Best Spent

- ♦ Nightlife is mostly in the form of pubs, but there are definitely clubs like The Art School, The Berkeley Suite, La Cheetah & Subclub.
- ♦ Breweries: Tennents Wellpark, Drygate, Oran Mór, Mono.
- ♦ Theatres: <u>Royal Concert Hall</u>, <u>Theatre Royal</u>, <u>Citizens Theatre</u>, <u>King's Theatre</u>, <u>Pavilion Theatre</u>, <u>Tron Theatre</u>, <u>Saint Luke's</u>, <u>CCA</u>, The Arches.

Free-Riding?

- Within the centre of Glasgow basically everything is at walking distance, but for the outskirts alternative transport is necessary.
- There's a bike sharing system in Glasgow: <u>Nextbike</u>.
- There's an extensive train and bus network in Scotland. Trains are more than double the price, leave from the Waverley station and are run by <u>Scotrail</u>. The central bus terminal is called Buchanan Bus Station, located at Killermont Street. There are many budget lines like <u>Megabus</u>. Prices for train and buses are cheaper when booked far in advance.
- Airport: Glasgow Airport (GLA).
- Hitch-hiking is relatively safe, although not very common... but possible. You can also use apps like Blablacar to get a cheap(er) ride.
