- 器 Local food: Deep-fried Mars bars (for real), Haggis (sheep's heart, liver & lungs), Shortbread (cookies), Porridge, Fish & Chips, Smoked Salmon, Scones, Neeps & Tatties (turnips & potatoes), Bangers & Mash (sausage with mashed potatoes), Black Pudding (blood-based), Leek & Tattie Soup, Scotch Pie (meat pie), Tablet (fudge), Scotch Egg... & Scotch Whiskey.
- **Go vegan:** Being vegan is ridiculously easy in Europe and also in Scotland. However, the UK is expensive and so is vegan food. Every bigger supermarket has an endless supply of vegan products and there are many vegan/vegetarian restaurants. Check them here: Happy Cow Skye.

Mama Said

- Europe in general, and also Skye is rather safe... but use your common sense like everywhere.
- Tap water is drinkable.
- International banks don't always accept Scottish pounds for exchange, so always require British notes shortly before leaving the country.
- If you're really on a budget, and have no money to spend... maybe the UK is not the place for you, as together with Scandinavia it's more expensive than the rest of Europe.

- ♦ Most bars can be found in the bigger cities, like Broadford and Portree. There's a whiskey distillery in Sleat: Praban na Linne.
- ♦ Other: <u>Skye Cinema</u>, <u>Aros Community Theatre</u>.

Free-Riding?

- Within the separate villages of Skye basically everything is at walking distance, but for to explore the main attractions and do some sightseeing alternative transport is necessary.
- It's certainly a nice environment to explore by bike, but there are no bicycle lanes and cars pass by closely on the main roads. Weather isn't always favourable either.
- There's an extensive train and bus network in Scotland. Trains are more than double the price and are run by <u>Scotrail</u>. No train goes directly to Skye, so you have to get out in Mallaig and take the ferry and then the bus. Buses don't go very often and stop only in designated bus stations. To travel towards Skye use <u>Citylink</u>.
- You can drive via the bridge of Kyle of Lochalsh or take the ferry (both for cars & pedestrians) in Armadale.
- Airport: Glasgow Airport (GLA).
- Hitch-hiking is relatively safe, although not very common... but possible. You can also use apps like Blablacar to get a cheap(er) ride.
