  Sopska Salata (salad with cheese), Riblja Corba (fish

  (Serbian börek), Palacinke (sort of pancake), Skembice

- **Go vegan:** Being vegan is ridiculously easy in Europe, but slightly challenging in Serbia. <u>Local</u> 'accidentally vegan' dishes: Prebranac (baked beans), Ajvar (red peppers garlic spread), Becar Paprikas (stew), Dzuvec (stew), Posna Sarma (filled cabbage rolls), Srpska Salata (salad), Posni Burek (vegan börek), Corba od Pecuraka (mushroom soup), Check veganfriendly restaurants here: Happy Cow Belgrade.

#### Mama Said

- Europe in general, and also Belgrade, is rather safe... but use your common sense like everywhere. Pick pocketing happens mainly in tourist areas.
- Boycott zoos or aquariums like Palic Zoo, Belgrade Zoo and the Public Aquarium, where animals are held in captivity.
- Tap water is drinkable.
- Don't exchange foreign currency on the streets of Belgrade, as the exchange rates are disastrous. Take Serbian Dinar into the country if possible, as also the ATM-exchange rates are really bad.

## Sleep Cheap

- ♦ Hostels and alternative accommodation are very affordable in Serbia, but includes a city tax. Book hostels with \$15 discount via this Booking.com link! Belgrade charges pretty high tourist taxes, so double-check this hidden costs before confirming the booking.
- ❖ Go Couchsurfing or Housesitting (20% discount for Trusted Housesitters via this link!) Also check WorkAway or HelpX for work-exchanges.

- ♦ **Nightlife areas:** Skadarlija, main streets city centre.
- ♦ Theatres: Narodno Pozorište u Beogradu (national theatre), Opera I Teatar Madlenijanum, Jugoslovensko Dramsko Pozorište, Terazije Theatre, Beogradsko Dramsko Pozorište, Bitef Theatre, Zvezdara Theatre, Little Theatre Duško Radovic.

### Free-Riding?

- Walking is an excellent option to see the more subtle details of downtown Belgrade. To see the entire city alternative transport might be necessary.
- Belgrade is connected by a bus/trolleybus/tram system, which can be rather slow due to traffic. A 'Bus Plus card' has to be bought and charged in advance in a kiosk and scanned upon entry. There are also minibuses, which are more expensive. The main bus terminal is located at Железничка 4. Budget bus lines are Eurolines and Flixbus.
- Trains twice as slow but twice as scenic. All departures are nowadays from new the Beograd Centar Station south of center (reached by bus 41).
- Airport: Belgrade Nikola Tesla Airport (BEG).
- Hitchhiking is relatively safe and quite common. You can also use apps like Blablacar for a cheap ride.
