'45: Added Macedonia-Bosnia-Montenegro: Social Federal Republic of Yugoslavia under Tito. '89: Milosevic pres Serbia (pro-Serbian nationalism with regards to Albanians in Kosovo). '91: Slovenia-Macedonia-Croatia-Bosnia out Yugoslavia. Rise nationalism & independence aspirations: bloody conflict Croats & Bosnian Muslims. UN sanctions Yugoslavia. '95: Srebrenica massacre Muslims by Bosnian Serb forces. End Bosnian war. '97: Milosevic pres Yugoslavia. '98: Kosovo Liberation Army rebels → brutal crackdown. - 器 Big supermarkets: Idea, Maxi, Lidl, Roda.
- **Markets:** on Saturday.
- ** Local food: Cevapi (grilled minced meat),
 Karadordeva Snicla (schnitzel), Sarma (cabbage rolls),
 Kackaval (cheese), Pirot Lamb, Peglana Kobasica
 (sausage), Pljeskavica (hamburger), Cvarci (pork rinds),
 Sopska Salata (salad with cheese), Riblja Corba (fish
 soup), Duvec (stew), Pecenje (roast meat), Punjene
 Paprike (stuffed paprikas), Gibanica (cheese pie), Burek
 (Serbian börek), Palacinke (sort of pancake), Skembice
 (tripe stew), Rakija (alcoholic drink).
- ## Go vegan: Being vegan is ridiculously easy in Europe, but slightly challenging in Serbia. Local 'accidentally vegan' dishes: Prebranac (baked beans), Ajvar (red peppers garlic spread), Becar Paprikas (stew), Dzuvec (stew), Posna Sarma (filled cabbage rolls), Srpska Salata (salad), Posni Burek (vegan börek), Corba od Pecuraka (mushroom soup). Check vegan-friendly restaurants here: Happy Cow Serbia. I found cheap nuts and seeds at Knjaza Milosa 86 and Prodavnica br.2 (Carbona Oaza).

Mama Said

- Europe in general, and also Serbia, is very safe... but use your common sense like everywhere.
- Tap water is drinkable. It's one of the healthiest water worldwide.

Sleep Cheap

- ❖ Hostels and alternative accommodation are very affordable in Serbia, tourist taxes my apply. (Wild) Camping is a good option in summer only. Book hostels with \$15 discount via this <u>Booking.com link</u>!
- ❖ Go Couchsurfing or Housesitting (20% discount for Trusted Housesitters via this link!) Also check WorkAway or HelpX for work-exchanges.

Free-Riding?

- Walking is an excellent option to see the more subtle details of downtown Pirot.
- Nis has some buses, but none of those will bring you to any of the touristic sights. You will need to walk, rent a car or hitchhike. The main bus terminal is located at Trg Republike.
- Trains are twice as slow but twice as scenic. Pirot's train station is located out of town and is called Bozurat.
- Airport: Constantine the Great Airport (Nis INI).
- Hitchhiking is relatively safe and quite common. You can also use apps like <u>Blablacar</u> for a cheap ride.
