- **Big supermarkets:** Sheng Siong, Giant, FairPrice, Cold Storage.

- **Go vegan:** Singapore had a very strong vegan scene, but nothing comes cheap in this country. Food stalls will give you the cheapest deal. An overview of vegan restaurants and food stalls can be found at Happy Cow Singapore.

Mama Said

- Singapore is generally safe, but not as safe as nationalists believe it to be. Pickpocketing and petty crime is still an issue. When buying electronics at Sim Lim Square, be aware of money scams.
- Boycott zoos like Singapore Zoo, River Safari and Jurong Bird Park.
- Tap water is not drinkable.
- Only cash out inside of banks, not on street ATMs.
 Currency is best exchanged in Little India or China
 Town due to favourable exchange rates.
- When shopping, bring your passport and save receipts to get a tax refund for over \$100 at the airport.
- If you hold an African passport or have a dark skin color, expect to face severe racism at the border. Singaporeans mistrust every person that isn't Asian or white and are quite proud of this attitude somehow.

Sleep Cheap

- ❖ Accommodation is ridiculously expensive in Singapore and you pay a lot for very low quality. Be ready to pay \$100 for a room without windows. <u>Air BnB</u> gives more for the same money here.
- Go Couchsurfing or house-sitting! Also check WorkAway.

Free-Riding?

- Singapore has a rather compact city center, but it's really too hot and humid to walk long distances.
- Singapore has a bike share system called <u>Obike</u>.
- Public transport is fast and easy, especially the metro / train (MRT) that operates according to a clear schedule. Only use the bus when you know at which stop to disembark, as it's not indicated. Single tickets can be bought. The bus terminal is located at several locations, the most central one being the Harbour Front (1 Maritime Square).
- Taxis are extremely expensive in Singapore. Uber is widely available and even cheaper is the local version: Grab. Still, be ready to pay more than anywhere else in South-East Asia.
- Airport: Changi International Airport (SIN).
- Hitch-hiking is quite uncommon in Singapore, and unless you're Chinese or white, people generally don't like foreigners here. Sad but true.
