Budget Bites

- **Big supermarkets:** All are expensive. Emart and Lotte are generally the cheapest ones out there. Daiso for toiletries.
- **Markets:** Jungang Market, Jumunjin Fish Market, Dongbu, Seobu, Seongnam, Okgye 5-day market.
- # Local food: Sokcho Ojingeo Sundae (stuffed squid), Potato Ongsimi, Sacheon Gwajul (sweet snack), Wonju Chueotang (loach soup), Kimchi (fermented vegetables), Galbi (marinated ribs), Yukgaejang (beef stew), Jjajangmyeon (noodles), Gim (toasted seaweed), Gogihui (Korean BBQ), Bibimbap (mixed rice), Mandu (dumplings), Kimbap (sushi), Haemul Pajeon (fried seafood pancake), Twigim (tempura), Tteokbokki (red rice cakes), Kkwong-Toryeom (pheasant breast), MelJeot (salted anchovy), Tangsuyuk (horse), Galbijjim (horse rib stew), Bulgogi (horse BBQ), Seongkae-Guk (sea urchin soup), Godeungeo (mackerel), Sora (turban shell), Gingyijuk / Mungejuk / Jogaejuk (rice porridge with crab / octopus / clams), Bingddeok (buckwheat rice cake), Makkoli (rice wine) & way more!
- 器 **Go vegan:** Being vegan quite hard in South Korea, as everything is written in Hangul, both menus and ingredients lists. For vegan restaurants, check <u>Happy</u> <u>Cow Gangneung</u>. In Chodang Sundubu Village a lot of tofu dishes can be found.

Festivals

Gyeongpo Cherry Blossom Festival: Apr.

- Gangneung Danoje Festival: June.
- Gangneung Coffee Festival: Oct.

Mama Said

- South Korea is a very safe place. Don't stress.
- Tap water is drinkable.
- Avoid places like Gangneung Baby Animal Farm where animals are held in captivity.

Sleep Cheap

- Tourist accommodation is very expensive in South Korea. Usually the cheapest deals can be found in hostels or via Air BnB: Get €25 free travel money with this link. Use this link for €15 discount at Booking.com.
- ❖ Most public beach campsites are free. Book the cheap national park campsites and shelters here.
- ❖ Jjimjilbangs are cheap Korean sauna's and include free overnight stays (sleeping rooms). Temple stays (Buddhist) are a bit pricier and can be found and booked here.
- ❖ Go Couchsurfing or Housesitting: get 20% off your yearly Trusted Housesitters membership via this link.

 Also check WorkAway for work-exchanges.

Free-Riding?

- Gangneung isn't that big, but to reach far out suburbs or Jumunjin taking a bus is necessary.
- Biking is possible and there's an extensive bicycle lane network. Car drivers are however rather inconsiderate.
- Google Maps and Moovit don't work well here, download the KakaoMap or Naver app for route planning (mostly in Korean, but recognizes place names in alphabet and has a map-function). A T-Money / Cashbee card provides discounts and up to 2 free transfers (within 30 minutes), it can be bought and charged in all minimarkets and works all over South Korea. Swipe when entering and leaving the bus. Intercity buses leave from Gangneung Intercity Bus Terminal, Gangneung Express Bus Terminal or Jumunjin Terminal.
- Trains are operated by <u>Korail</u> and leave from the central train station. There are both expensive fast-trains as well as slower and very cheap (*Mugunghwa*) local trains.
- Airport: Yangyang International Airport (YNY).
- Hitchhiking is possible, but rather hard in a city as you'll mainly catch inner-city traffic. Main highways are illegal to enter, so limit routes to provincial roads.
