'74: Revised constitution: democracy by referendum. 1914-18: WWI. '19-20: Versailles Treaty → reaffirms neutrality. '20: Joins League of Nations, headquarters in Geneva. '23: Union with Liechtenstein. '39-45: WWII, Federal Council issues declaration of neutrality. Refuses to join UN. '59: Founder member of EFTA. 4 Party Government System. '63: Joins Council of Europe. '67: Right-wing campaigns anti-immigration. '71: Women vote. '85: Referendum: Equal female rights in marriage. Immigrant nr's restricted. # Budget Bites

- **Big supermarkets:** Gstaad only: Denner, Coop, Migros.
- # Local food: Fondue (melted cheese), Rösti (potato dish), Zopf (Sunday bread), Bürli (small breads),
  Raclette (grilled cheese dish), Pastetli (meat pie), Rippli (pork ribs), Berner Platte (mixed meat),
  Älplermagronen (potatoes-macaroni dish), Saffron
  Risotto, Polenta, Zürcher Geschnetzeltes (veal with mushrooms), Rüebli Kuchen (carrot cake), Magenbrot (sweet bread), Birchermüesli (mixed muesli), Basler
  Leckerli (glazed ginger bread), Büdnernusstorte (nut pastry), Meringue, Chocolate, Cheese.
- **Go vegan:** Being vegan is ridiculously easy in Europe, and also in Switzerland. Restaurants in general are just very expensive in Switzerland. Check vegan-friendly restaurants here: <a href="Happy Cow Gstaad">Happy Cow Gstaad</a>.

#### Mama Said

- Europe is generally safe... and Switzerland is one of the safest countries in Europe. Relax.
- Tap water is drinkable. In the Alps you can even drink river water.
- People speak a very specific dialect of German, that is basically a language on its own and can't be understood with 'normal' German skills. Simply request to speak 'Hoch Deutsch'. This area is bordering the Francophone-part of Switzerland. Francophones don't speak / don't want to speak German (or English), Swiss Germans do speak French as well (and English).

# Sleep Cheap

- ❖ Hostels and alternative accommodation are very expensive in Switzerland. Check <u>Booking.com</u> for deals, but always book directly to avoid fees. Also check <u>Sleep</u> on <u>Straw</u>. <u>Air BnB</u> usually has slightly cheaper deals.
- ❖ Go Couchsurfing or Housesitting (20% discount for Trusted Housesitters via this link!). Also check WorkAway or HelpX for work-exchanges. Wild camping not allowed, but you can sneak off in the mountains.

# Nights Best Spent

- ♦ Nightlife areas: Gstaad main street (expensive).
- ♦ Theatres: Ciné-Theater Gstaad.

#### Free-Riding?

- Walking is an excellent option to see the more subtle details without spending money. It's in fact the main attraction outside of ski season. The easy Philosopher's trail along the river connects Saanen and Gstaad (30 min).
- Biking is another fun way to explore. Bicycle hire is available at several bike shops in Saanen and Gstaad.
- There's a train and bus connection. Trains are operated by the <u>SBB</u> and the earlier you book, the cheaper your ticket. <u>Trainline</u> has good flash-sales, but terrible customer service. The so-called 'post-buses' operate the area, check Moovit or Google Maps for times. They're very expensive though.
- Hitchhiking is a safe and convenient option in this area.
- Airports: Luchthaven Zürich (ZRH) / Geneva Airport (GVA), Bern Airport (BRN).
