- **E Local food: Sis Kebab (meat skewer), Iskender Kebab (kebab with rice / tomato sauce), Durum (wrap), Çig Köfte (spicy sticky bulgur), Köfte (meat), Sarma / Dolma (rice in wine leaves), Kebab (meat in wrap), Baklava (sweet pastries), Muhammara (pepperand-walnut-dip), Gozleme (salty pancakes), Pilav (rice), Kumpir (stuffed potato), Simit (sesame bagel), Islak Burgers (wet hamburgers), Pide (Turkish pizza), Mezze (fingerfood), Mercimek Corbasi (lentil soup), Borek (stuffed crispy bread), Su Boregi (borek-lasagne-crossover), Menemen (scrambled egg), Manti (kind-ofravioli), Lahmacun (crispy bread topped with meat/salad), Balik Ekmek (fish sandwich), Lokum (Turkish Delight).
- **Go vegan:** Being vegan is pretty easy in this part of the world. Many local dishes are vegan on their own, such as: Çig Köfte, Sarma / Dolma, Potato or Spinach Gozleme, Simit, Kumpir (without meat and mayonnaise), Kisir, Bakla (bean appetizer), Ispanak Kavurma (roasted spinach), Patlican Ezmesi (eggplant puree), Acile Ezme and Fava (bean puree). Besides Çig Köfte food take-outs, there are many vegan/ vegetarian restaurants: check them on Happy Cow Istanbul.

Mama Said

- Turkey is pretty safe, and assaults are uncommon. But like everywhere, use common sense, pickpocketing happens in busy areas and on public transport. I didn't feel super safe in Belgrad Forest.
- Drugs are illegal, and sentences are high.
- Even though Turkey is Islamic, Istanbul is very modern and all types of dress are common. Females traveling solo are as safe as anywhere in a big city, just avoid walking alone at night or in very remote areas.
- Tap water is not drinkable, use filtered water.
- Haggling is common and expected.
- The 'okay'-sign means 'homosexual'. Just sayin'.

Sleep Cheap

- Hostels and alternative accommodation are relatively cheap in Turkey, but not so much in high season (summer). Wild camping is legal and even encouraged.
- The cheapest and most interesting way to go:
 Couchsurfing or house-sitting! Also check WorkAway.

Nights Best Spent

- ♦ **Nightlife areas:** Taksim/Istiklal, Beyoglu, Ortakoy, Besiktas Pier, Amalimescit, Cezayir St., Karakoy, Kadikoy (*Iskele St.*), Kumkapi.
- ♦ Theatre: Sürreya Opera House, Etrugrul Theatre, Moda Stage, Kadiköy Haldun Taner Stage, Grand Pera, Sehir Tiyatrolari, Hodjapasha Cultural Center & more.

Free-Riding?

- Istanbul is very big. The separate areas are walkable, but to get around from area to area alternative transport is necessary.
- Cycling is possible, but rather uncommon. Traffic doesn't pay much attention to cyclists and roads aren't great for bicycles.
- The main bus terminals (Otogar) are Ayüp (Nişanca / Bahariye Cd) and Essenler (Altintepsi Mh.), but there are several (verify before departure). The main train station is called Marmaray Sikerci (Fatih area). One can travel from Bulgaria by bus or night train. Within the city center there are bus-, metro-, tram- and funicularlines. The cheapest option is buying the rechargeable Istanbul Card from the yellow machine in any metro station, which you swipe upon entry. Use the Moovit app for routes. Minibuses serve outer neighborhoods such as Tuzla, here you pay cash (verify rate with locals).
- Airport: Istanbul Airport (IST); Sabiha Gokcen (SAW)
- Hitch-hiking is not too common nor safe in Turkey (speaking from experience). It's better to use apps like Blablacar to get a cheap(er) ride.
