Budget Bites

- **Big supermarkets:** Auchan, Silpo, MegaMarket, Novus, Welmart, Billa.
- **Markets:** Bessarabsky, Lesnaya, Vladimirsky, Demiivsky, Petrovka, Kurenevskiy, Zhitny, Lukhyanovsky Market ("Rynok").
- ** Local food: Varenyky (dumplings), Borscht (beet soup), Salo (pig fat), Kasha (buckwheat), Chicken Kiev (breaded stuffed chicken breast), Deruny (potato pancakes), Golubtsi (stuffed cabbage rolls), Okroshka (kefir soup), Holodest (meat jelly dish), Syrniki (cottage cheese small pancakes), Sausages, Potato Salad, Pechenya (roasted meat), Nalisnyky / Mlyntsi (stuffed pancakes), Pyrih (stuffed pie), Pampushka (yeasted buns), Banosh (corn porridge), Koliva (porridge), Kutia (sweet grain pudding). Drink a Horilka (spirit).
- **Go veg:** Going veg is rather complicated in Ukraine, but not so much in the capital Kyiv. "Accidentally" veg Ukrainian dishes are: Kasha, some veg-filled Varenyky, Borscht, Deruny, Syrniki and some Nalisnyky / Mlyntsi (note that most contains cheese, egg and/or sour cream). Every supermarket has vegan and vegetarian products and there are some veg-friendly restaurants: Happy Cow Kyiv.

Mama Said

- Ukraine is generally safe, outside of the political unstable regions (*Donetsk / Luhansk / Crimea*). Kyiv is a capital city, so like everywhere else, take your general precautions.
- Boycott zoos like the Kyiv Zoo, where animals are held in captivity.
- Tap water is drinkable.
- In Ukraine, homosexuality is unfortunately not widely approved. Abortion is legal during the first 12 weeks of pregnancy, but some reli fanatics try to reverse this progress.

Free-Riding?

- I walked most things in Kyiv, but don't be mistaken: this city is very big. Whatever looks close on the map is most definitely not. Check distances in advance.
- Cycling is possible, though not too common. There is a bike sharing system called <u>NextBike</u>, with rates of UAH 30 per half hour and UAH 300 per day.
- Public transport comes in metro, buses, trolleybuses, trams, and funiculars. Google Maps is pretty accurate. It's very cheap and tickets can be bought in the stations or on the vehicle itself and must be validated before usage. You pay for each ride, not for a certain time period. Alternatively, you can buy a Kyiv Smart Card for ease of usage. The penalty for traveling without a ticket is UAH 160. From Boryspil Airport, you can take the Skybus or train (cheapest option).
- Taxis are famous tourist scams. It's better to use Uber or for longer distances: Blabla Car.
- Airport: Boryspil National Airport & Zhuliany / Kyiv National Airport.
- Hitch-hiking is rather uncommon, but people will pick you up. However, English is not widely spoken. Prepare for awkward silences.
